- The Nuremberg laws caused Jews, Homosexuals, Gypsies, Communists and other "Undesirables" were forced to wear identification badges.



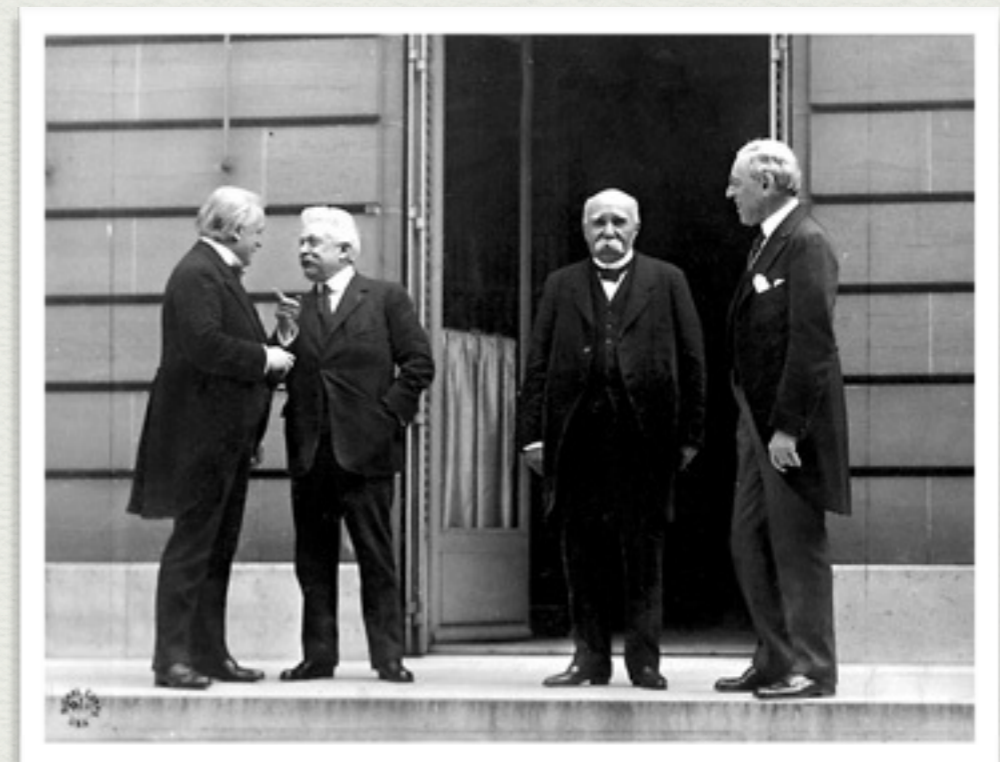
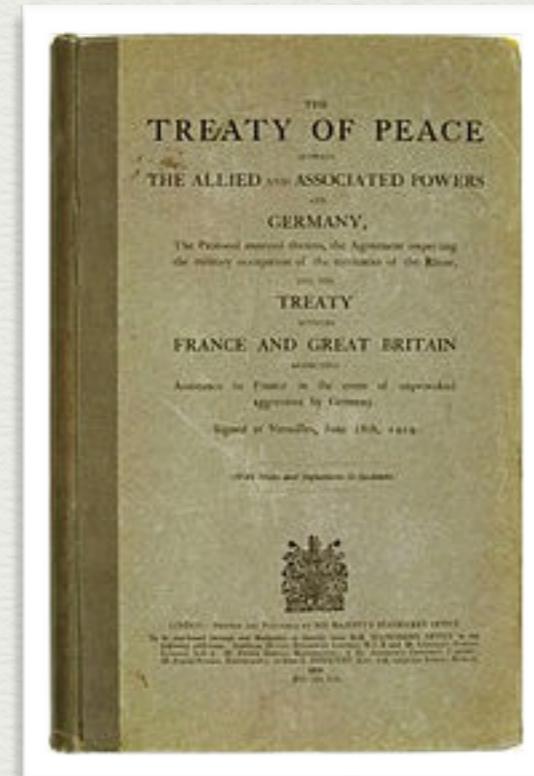
Nazi Party
