



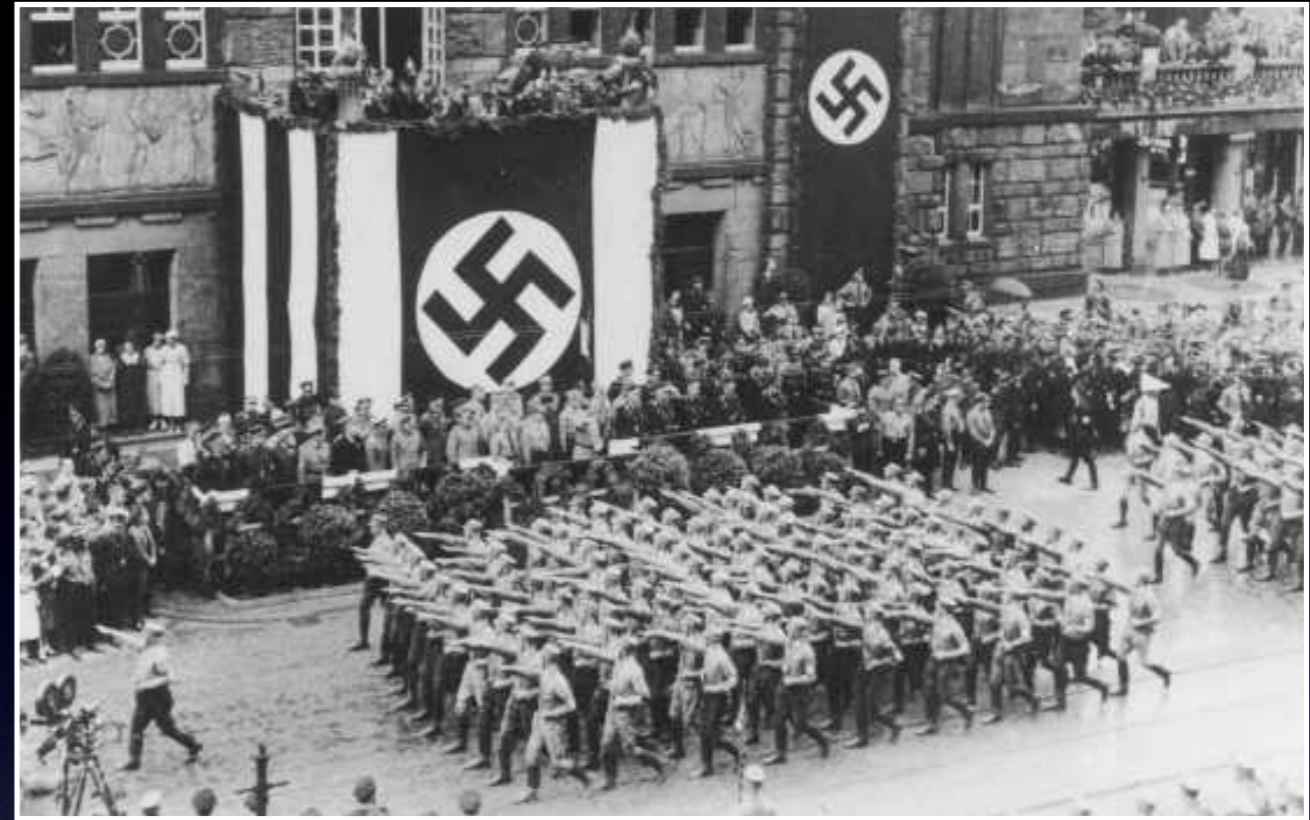
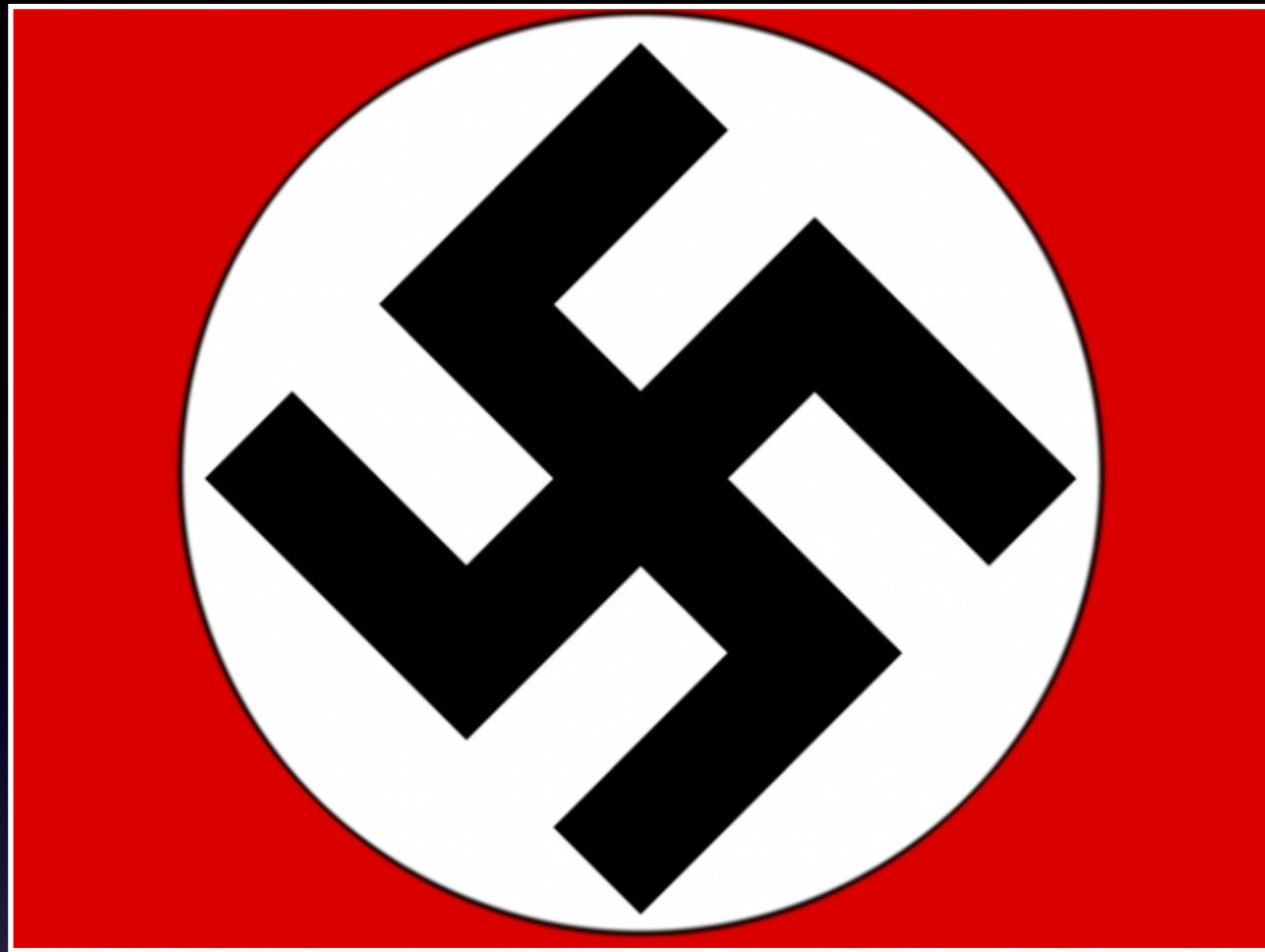
Causes of World War II

Adolf Hitler

Born 4/20/1889 in Austria, Adolf Hitler joined the army at a young age. He became mad that Germany lost WW1 and decided to become involved in politics. He worked his way up to becoming the Fuhrer with complete control. He committed suicide on 4/29/1945

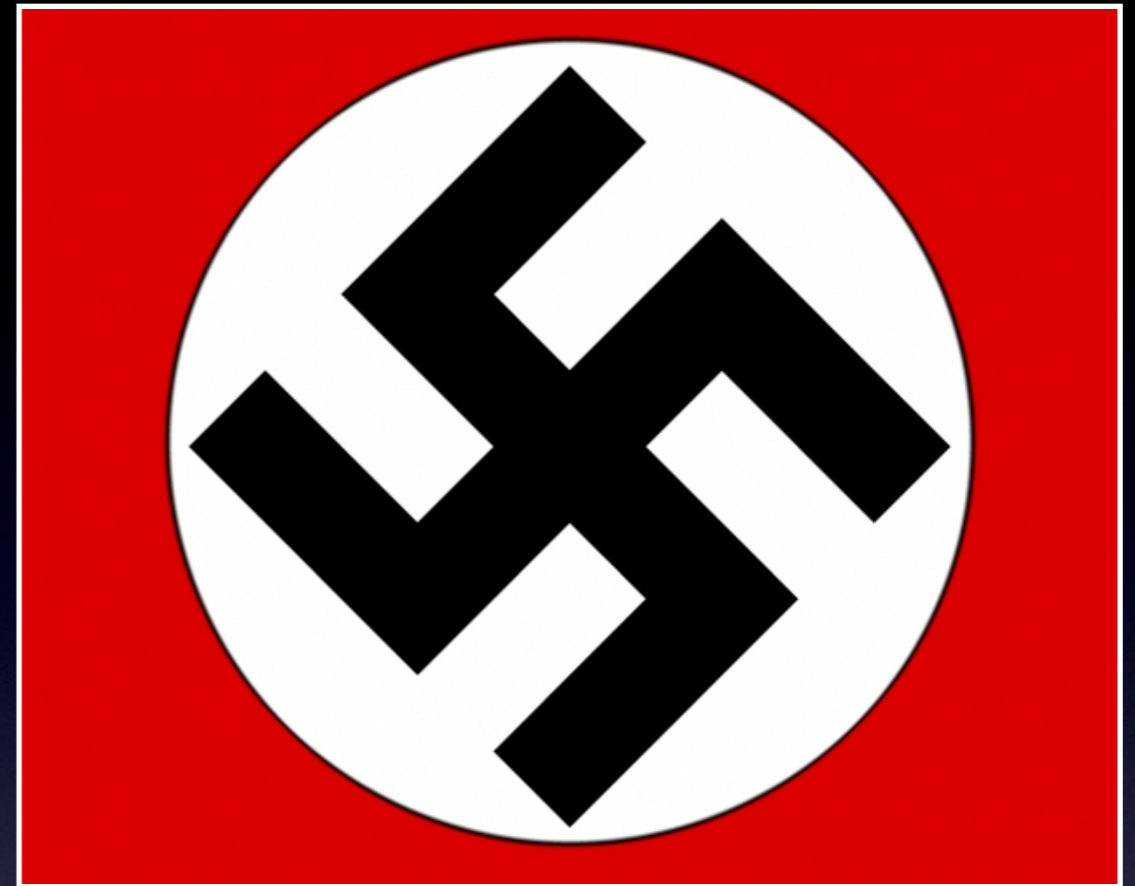
The Treaty of Versailles was an unfair treaty that put all the blame of WWI.

damages of the war

Disarmament- Germany had to have a small army

Territorial Clauses- land was taken away from
Germany.

Germany invaded Austria, Rhineland, and Czecchoslovakia.
Britain and France began to give into his demands

Failure of Appeasement



- Germany felt threatened by France and started to re-arm and stationed troops on the Rhineland.
- They made the Munich Agreement but Hitler went against it and invaded the rest of Czechoslovakia.
