

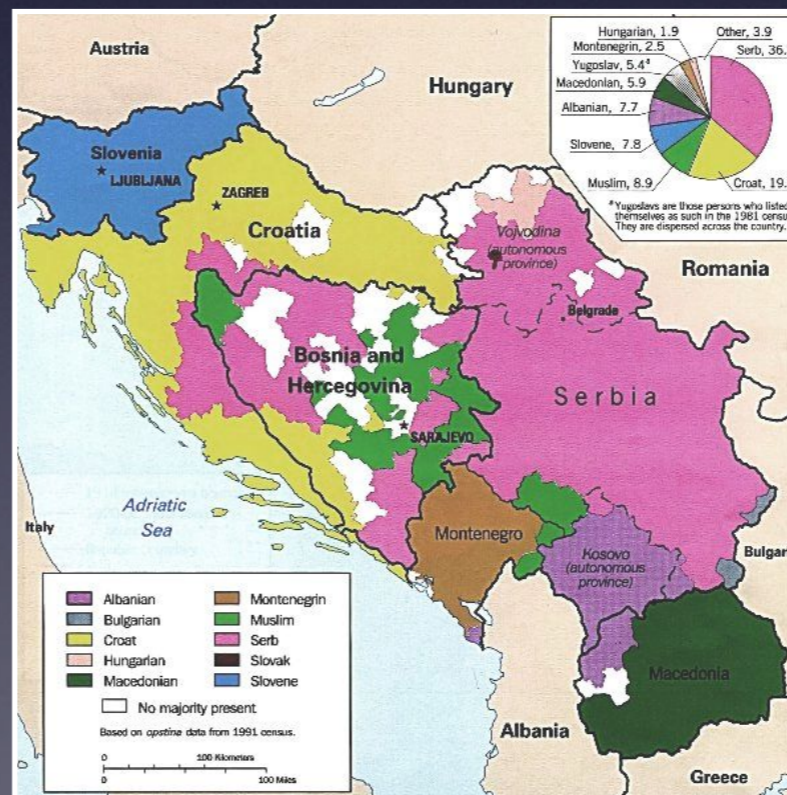


Bosnia-Herzegovina

Bosnia-Herzegovina

- Happened between 1992-1995 in Bosnia.
- The genocide was Serbs against Muslims.
- The Serbs leader had a hatred for Muslims.

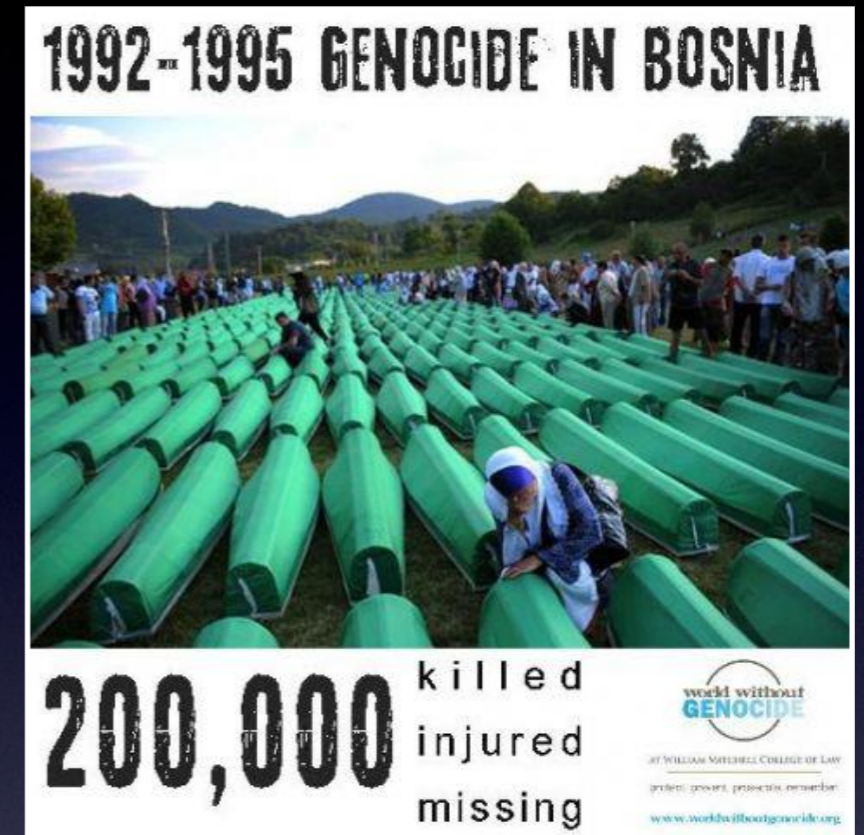


What They Did:

- They slaughtered nearly 8,000 men and boys between the age of 12 and 60.
- They terrorized Muslim families into leaving their villages by using rape as a weapon against women and girls.
- Boys and men were forced into make-shift concentration camps.
- All the dead they buried in mass burials.

Total Losses:

- 200,000 deaths.
- 20,000 people were missing.
- 2,000,000 people were refugees.



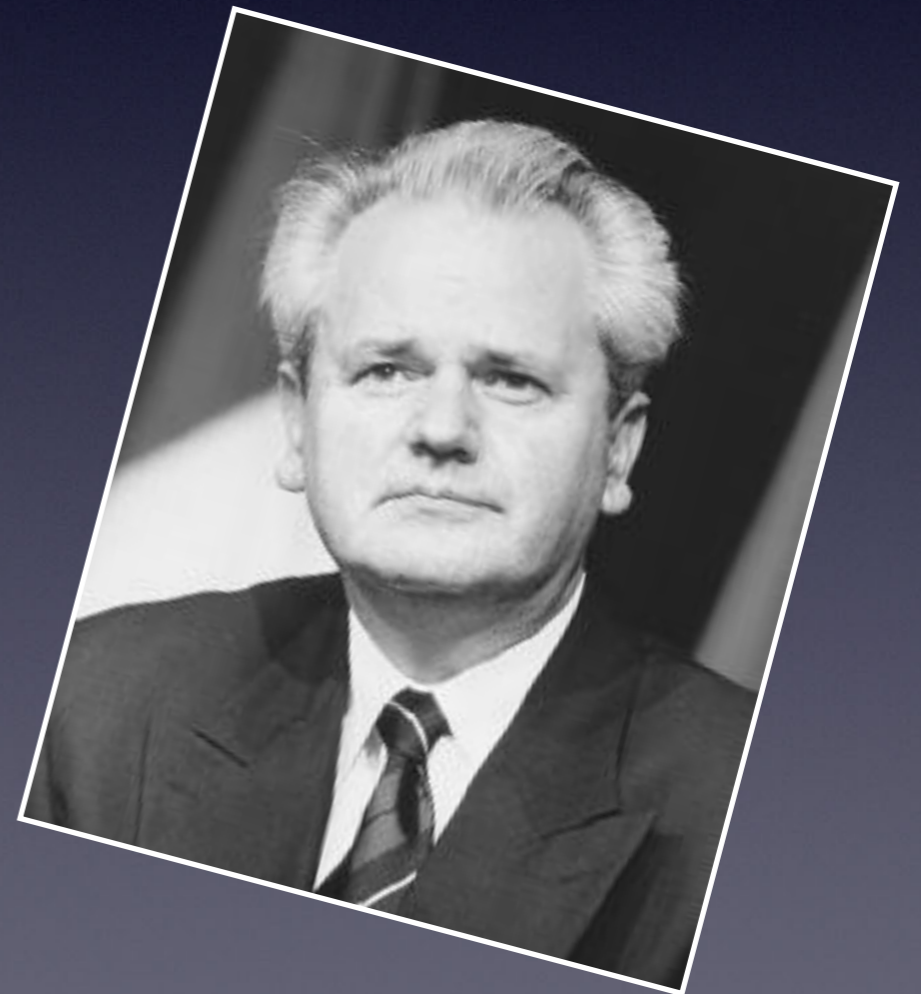
Genocide: Organization.

- The Serbs operated under the local leadership of Radovan Karadzic, president of the illegitimate Bosnian Serb Republic.



Genocide: Polarization.

- In 1991 Milosevic's army invaded Croatia to 'protect' the Serbian minority. They bombarded, out numbered and gunned down the Croatians for 86 consecutive days.



Genocide: Extermination.

- Mass shooting.
- Slaughtered nearly 8,000 men and boys.
