What was the benefit of the railroad in Britain during the early industrial age? Easy transportation, Easy trading

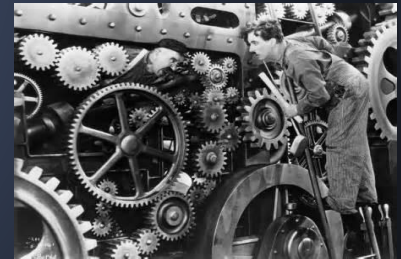
What were some positive (social/economic) aspects of industrialization? Prices for goods went down, easy transportation.

What happened as a result of the Sepoy Mutiny in India? The British Gov't took direct command of India.

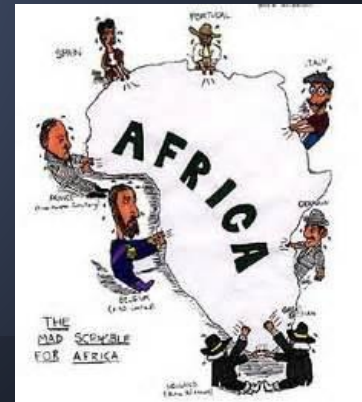
Why did Western nations desire lands in the Pacific Rim? Because of their natural resources and strategic location.

What prompted Great Britain and France to declare war on Germany at the start of World War II? The invasion of Poland.

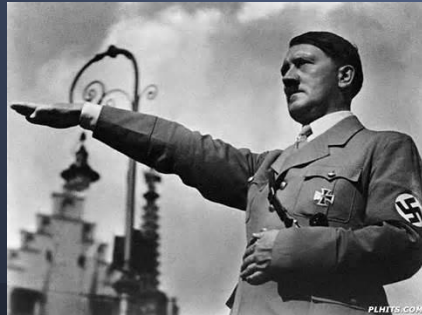
What was addressed by the Nuremberg trials? The Holocaust
