


# Nazi Holocaust


#### General Information

Who: The Nazis and the Jewish People




- When: 1938 1945
- Where: Germany, then eventually Europe
- Total Losses: 6,000,000 deaths
- Did What?: Nazi followers attempted to exterminate the Jewish people from Europe.





 Why- The Holocaust occurred because Hitler and the Germans repeatedly blamed the Jews for Germany's defeat in World War 1 and subsequent economic hardships. Germans also believed Jews were inferior, and didn't deserve to be treated as humans.



How- Jews were starting to be gradually shut out of German society by the nazis through many laws and decrees such as the Nuremberg laws of 1935. The hatred towards Jews was finally let loose on the night acknowledged as the beginning of the Holocaust, The Night of Broken Glass (Kristallnacht). Jews were killed, synagogues burned, homes and businesses destroyed, and the first mass arrest took place where they were taken to concentration camps and ghettos. Many died from disease and hunger within these places but were also subjected to mass shootings and gas



 Classification- The Germans against Jews. Germans with fair skin, blond hair, and blue eyes were the supreme form of human. To Hitler, Jews were the racial opposite.

 Symbolization- The yellow Star of David




### Dehumanization

Jews were portrayed as the enemies of the Germans and as plague carrying rats.

The Nazi Party: The attacks were carefully orchestrated smear campaigns. The Nazi Party had everyone against the Jews.



## Polarization

The Nuremberg laws made the Jews unable to marry any Germans. Other groups started to turn against the laws



## Preparation

## Extermination

 Jews were told they were off to take a shower but they were really sent to gas chambers held in concentration camps used for mass murders.
