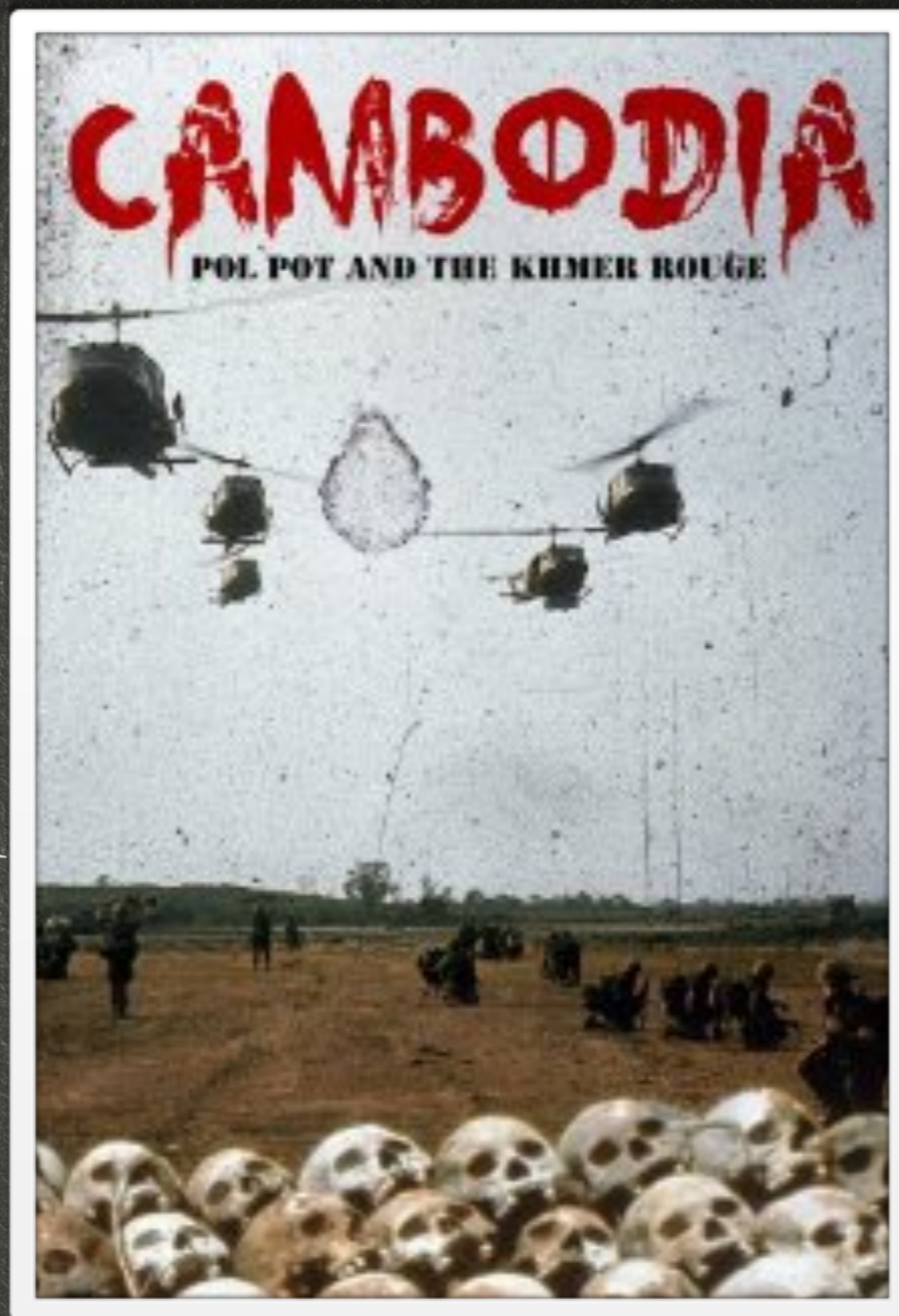

# WHO?

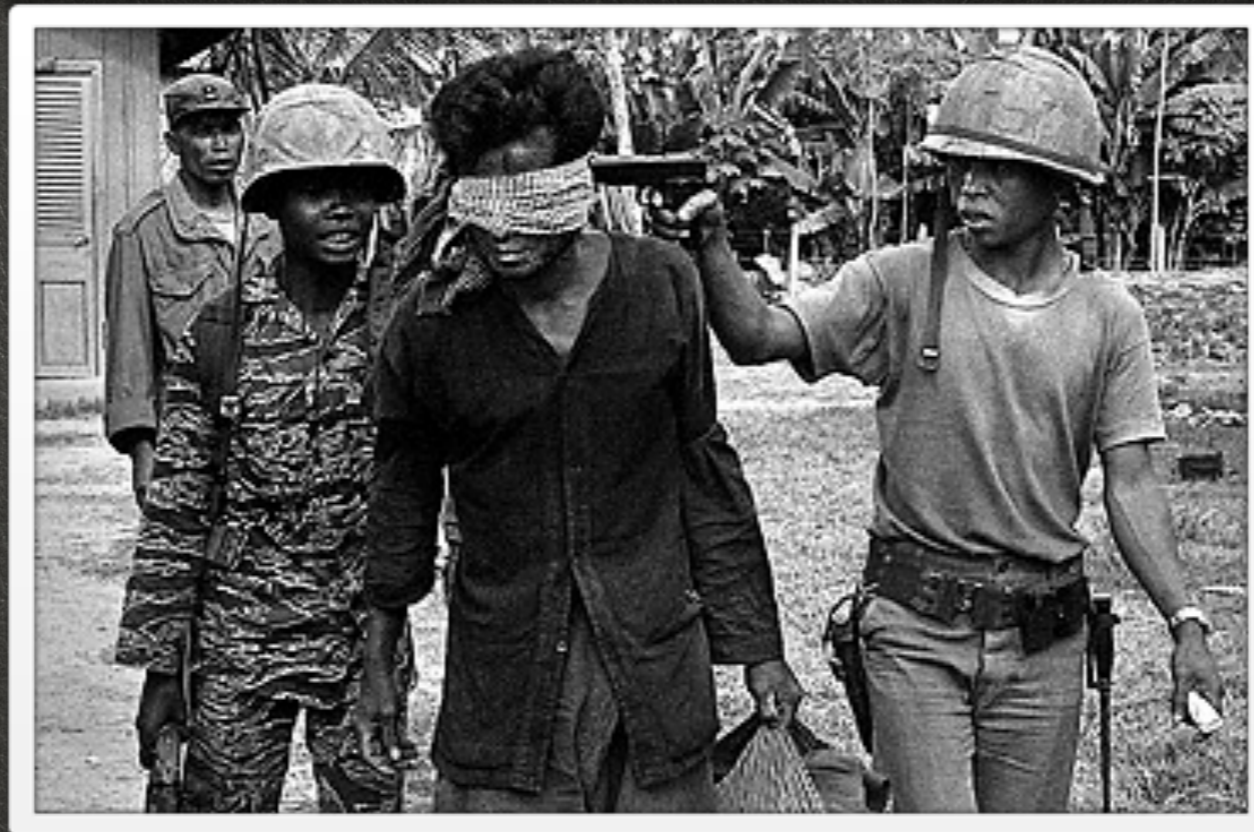
- Pol Pot was the leader of the Khmer Rouge (Red Cambodians)- Pol Pot's resistance movement against Prince Norodom Sihanouk.

# DID WHAT?

- All foreigners were expelled, embassies closed, and any foreign economic or medical assistance was refused. Foreign language banned, newspapers and tv stations closed, radio stations were closed, and bikes taken.
- All of Cambodia's cities were evacuated, 20,000 died. (Example of Organization)  
Ex soldiers were killed with wives and children- any suspected of disloyalty.  
(Example of Dehumanization and Extermination)
- Killed Muslims who refused to eat pork. (Example of symbolization)



# WHEN & WHERE?

The genocide took place during 1975-1979 all over the country of Cambodia.



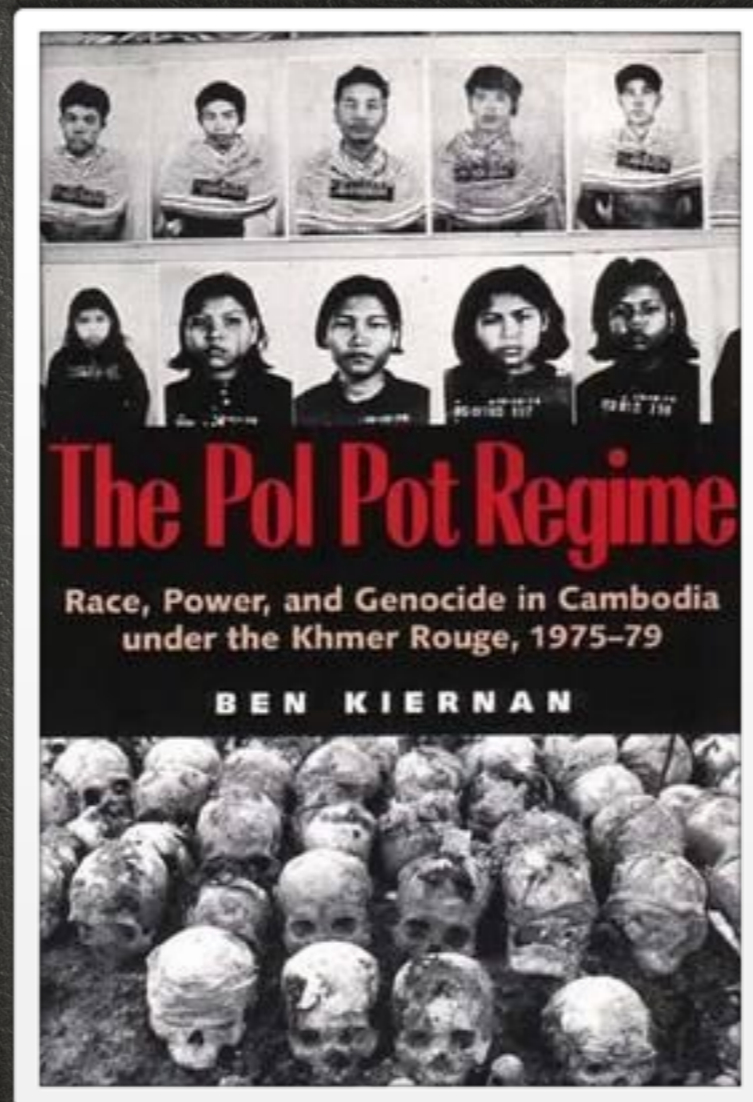
# HOW?

- Many were shot for small infractions while working in the crop fields.
- Most of the people killed died from starvation, over-working, and dehydration
- People were forced to work 18 hours a day and received a small cup of rice every other day in return.
- Targets of the genocide included minorities and members of the "old society" (doctors, lawyers, educated people, and the wealthy)



# WHY?

- Pol Pot wanted to "purify" capitalism, western culture, city life, religion, and all foreign influences were to be extinguished in favor of an extreme form of peasant communism.



# TOTAL LOSSES:

- When Cambodia's cities were forcibly evacuated, 20,000 died.
- 50% of the 425,000 Chinese living in Cambodia died.



# POLARIZATION:

- Young people were taken from their parents and placed in Communals. They were later married in collective ceremonies involving hundreds of often unwilling couples.



# PREPARATION:

- 10 to 15 families lived with a chairman at the head of each group.
