It has a border with Croatia to the North and southwest 345 km.

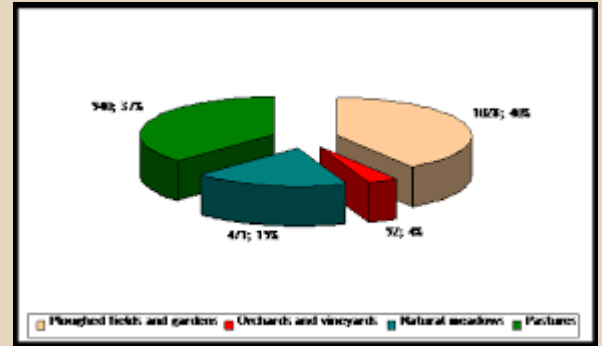
Political Factors
