Soviet Union and Joseph Stalin.

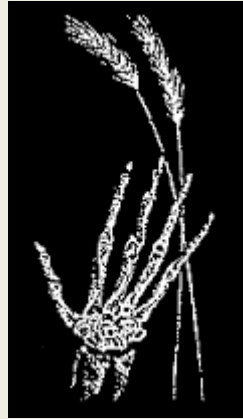


# Motives

- Mothers had sent their children on trains in hope of they will survive the famine but they didn't

# Death

Close to 6,000,000 to 7,000,000 people died including 3,000,000 children

Americans and other people tried to help out by sending food to Europe but the shipments were being seized by the Soviet Union.
